They have all worked tremendously hard over the last few weeks to make sure that they are as ready as they could possibly be. Year 2 are also doing some tests over the next couple of weeks but theirs will be much more low key. Many of the children will not even realise that they have done a test as we try to make them as much like a normal lesson as we possibly can.

Also on our uniform page, you will notice that in the jewellery section it states that watches are allowed if they are simply to support your child in learning how to tell the time. These should preferably be very basic and simple to read. You should avoid unnecessarily expensive watches as there is always the chance that it could either go missing or return home in many pieces. We do not allow smart watches or fit-bit style watches for reasons of a safeguarding nature. If your child is seen wearing one they will be asked to remove it by school staff.
